oincidence and luck" are what Rick Derringer call his reasons for getting into music. At 17 his group the McCoys had a hit with "Hang On Sloopy" and he's been running with the guitar ever since. Besides his work as a solo artist, he's also recorded with Johnny and Edgar Winter, Todd Rundgren and Steely Dan.

"I'm a collector perhaps for better reasons than people who call themselves guitar collectors," Derringer explained. "If there's a guitar that has something unique to offer, I should have it because I'm going to use it." To this end Rick has about 20 guitars, including a rebuilt T.V. model Les Paul from the late '50s. He calls it a "souped up sports car kind of guitar."
The original pickup is now a humbucker
with a second one installed. There's a
toggle switch for pickup separation and
phasing, and the neck has been cut
down so it's smaller.

"I've got an old Explorer, either the first or second one made. You can tell by the v-shaped head. It's got one of the most consistent necks from top to bottom of any guitar I own. There's a '58 Les Paul Sunburst with a Bigsby, that's real special to collectors. You also see pictured a '55 Dan Electro with three pickups and one cutaway. It's the model Duane Eddy used on 'Rebel Rouser,' and still one of the best sounding guitars. It's similiar to the top end of a Tele and the bottom of a Gibson.

There's a stone guitar and the body's made of granite. It has a maple neck with an ebony fret board. It has all sterling silver binding that's molded directly into each fret. I like this guitar especially for slide.

"I have a double neck made for me by Charles LoBue. Both necks are small Gibson style necks. The body is one piece of birch, which gives it good sustain. There's also a nice vintage '59 Strat. It's got a sweet pretty sound and I love to play it in the studio." Rick's main axe is a B.C. Rich old style Mockingbird, which he says is "better than any old Gibson."

"Anyone can buy one and it's gonna be that good," he said.
